Through the centuries, the ?Ruperto-Carola University? maintained its prominent worldwide reputation, and in 2008 was named as one of nine national ?**Universities of Excellence**? in Germany.

Discovery tours in the old quarter and castle, leisurely walks on the Philosophenweg (Philosopher?s Way), and a ride on the historic mountain railway to the top of the Königstuhl mountain, situated more than 500 meters above the city, will offer you glimpses into Heidelberg?s colorfully varied history.
